How to wash your Kevlar® gloves

Kevlar is a strong fiber that will never lose its cut resistance properties, strength or weight. It won't even shrink when washed - if you treat the gloves as you should. Kevlar will resist almost anything, but it cannot stand against certain strong acids, chemicals, oxidizers or bleach.

DONT'S

Do not under any circumstances use strong acids, bleach or any extra "whitening" or "strength" detergents for your glove wash. It'll make the yarn weaken and you'll have a worthless gloves on your hands - litterally.

What you want is to use for your gloves is regular detergents. The same detergent you use everyday, for light-stained clothes.

DO'S



Use the recommended amount of detergent and wash in a regular cycle in 60°C for 30 minutes.

Rinse the gloves thoroughly with hot water. And give them a cold splash of water before moving onto next step.

Throw them into the tumble dryer for 30 minutes at 70°C. Now that wasn't too hard was it?
