

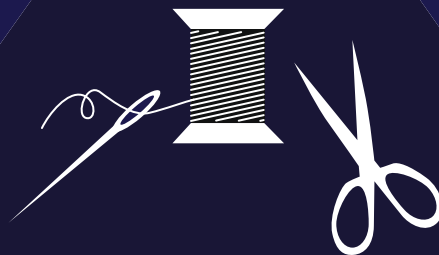
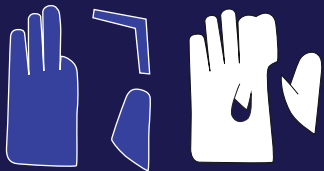
The Making of the Glove

When making gloves there's more to it than meets the eye. It's a hard and difficult process that requires great innovators, skilled cutters and creative pattern makers and detailed craftsmanship. What follows is only an introduction of what it takes to create only one of Soft Touch gloves.



Raw Material - When choosing the material one must know the gloves purpose. The different treatment processes of materials can make one and the same material feel and act as ten different ones – all depending on how it's manufactured. Only someone very knowledgeable about styles of treatment can know what material to use.

Pattern - A skilled pattern maker can look at a glove and instantly be able to break it down into pieces and know how it was crafted. The pattern determines the fit of the glove and how to make it long-lasting in its area of use. In some ways the pattern is the most important to get right and it's a job for someone creative with a flexible state of mind.



Finishing touches - The gloves are always sewn inside out so the person turning it properly always does the first quality check. He will feel the gloves resilience, the materials softness/hardness and check the stitching. The next person controlling the gloves also brushes it up and hands it over for the last check when adding the gloves up in pairs.

Testing - At last our factory staff will open boxes ready for shipment, to perform a last quality check. These tests are always done randomly to guarantee the gloves high quality. The tests will then consist of fitting, feel and quality of material and double-checking of suspected durability.

Cutting - When cutting the material it is crucial to get it exactly right. A piece that's not the proper size will be useless. It won't fit the model and it'll be a great waste. Therefore the person cutting all the material has to be focused and detail-oriented to get everything just right.

Stitching - The stitching is also very detailed and must be done with precision. In many ways the thread and lining of stitches makes or breaks the gloves durability. The quality of thread and accuracy of the seamstress is definitive.
